AREA'S LARGEST JOB EXPO FOR ADULTS WITH DISABILITIES COMES TO FARMINGDALE



Hundreds of job seekers filled Roosevelt Hall at Farmingdale State College to meet with recruiters from over two dozen Long Island companies.

Old Bethpage, NY – Over 300 hundred attendees filled Roosevelt Hall at Farmingdale State College for the Annual Community Partnership Forum and Talent Connection Job Expo for adults with disabilities hosted by Family Residences and Essential Enterprises, Inc. (FREE), in partnership with ACLD, Life's WORC and the

YAI Network. The "Talent Connection" Job Expo is the largest of its kind in the area, offering adults with disabilities an opportunity to discuss their skills and abilities with recruiters from key businesses on Long Island. The event was a great opportunity for individuals to become familiar with potential employers as well as learn valuable information at the employment workshops that were offered.

"We are thrilled with the turnout at this year's Job Expo," said Robert S. Budd, CEO FREE. The Forum also included a panel with companies, job coaches and individuals with disabilities who are employed, and Top Star Employer Awards. The Top Star Employers were honored by New York State Senator John E.
